MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Dear Parents & families,

You will be aware that on Monday 4 January, the Prime Minister announced a national lockdown in order to reduce the spread of COVID-19, which has now come into effect. Full details of the lockdown restrictions including the stay at home message can be found at www.gov.uk/guidance/national-lockdown-stay-at-home. Larkswood will remain open only for the children of critical workers and vulnerable children and young people to attend. All other pupils and students will receive remote education until February half term and must remain at home, in line with national guidance.

I understand this will not be welcome news for many parents and carers, but it is absolutely essential if we are to successfully protect the NHS and reduce the transmission of the virus. In Waltham Forest we have witnessed the growing pressure on our NHS provisions, and the wider health system during the past few weeks

As a school, we have adapted well to the current situation and were prepared for the impact and changes that were to be had on us and our school community. Earlier today I spent some time reviewing home learning on Seesaw and went in to each year group to review the children's learning - as ever, I am in awe of the resilience of your children, their attitudes to learning and the high expectations that they have of themselves is simply phenomenal.

From Monday 4th January our teachers have been busy providing high quality learning activities via SEESAW. From Nursery through to Year 6 the children are provided with daily activities which cover their specific curriculums. In Early Years these cover aspects of the prime areas of learning. In Years 1-6 these focus on Reading, Writing and Maths curriculum daily as well as wider subject areas on a weekly basis. In September 2020 we launched a new curriculum and this is what you'll see reflected in our remote learning- we are so proud of it and we hope you enjoy being able to get a taster of it via SEESAW.

We know that remote learning can be challenging for children and families. Please remember that although it would be great to cover all of the learning, we understand that this isn't possible all of the time. Putting in place a consistent routine can support home learning- starting at the same time each morning (ideally first thing) and factoring in break times after each subject is really useful. Minimising distractions and ensuring children have a clear, comfortable work space is really important.

Our remote learning policy and framework will be finalised next week and uploaded to the school website.

Free School Meal Entitlement and Provision

We understand that families continue to live in uncertain times and many are facing changes to their financial circumstances as a result. Finally, I would like to thank you for your continued support of our schools, and your compliance with the wider national restrictions in place. Whilst last year was extremely challenging, , I was extremely proud to see how we all pulled together as a community and kept our spirits high. I have every confidence that together we will all play our part to protect ourselves and those around us.

SEESAW HOMELEARNING

From Monday 4th January our teachers have been busy providing high quality learning activities via SEESAW. From Nursery through to Year 6 the children are provided with daily activities which cover their specific curriculums. In Early Years these cover aspects of the prime areas of learning. In Years 1-6 these focus on Reading, Writing and Maths curriculum daily as well as wider subject areas on a weekly basis. In September 2020 we launched a new curriculum and this is what you'll see reflected in our remote learning- we are so proud of it and we hope you enjoy being able to get a taster of it via SEESAW.

We are utilising the SEESAW program to its full potential and using videos and voice notes to support your child's learning. During the lessons skills will be modelled on video by your teacher before they then move on to practice and develop this themselves. Key Worker children attending school are covering the same learning on site.

We know that remote learning can be challenging for children and families. Please remember that although it would be great to cover all of the learning, we understand that this isn't possible all of the time. Putting in place a consistent routine can support home learning- starting at the same time each morning (ideally first thing) and factoring in break times after each subject is really useful. Minimising distractions and ensuring children have a clear, comfortable work space is really important. We upload the learning for the following day at 4pm each day, this is to enable parents to look over the learning to be covered the next day. Once the children have watched the teacher input on a session, they will have the opportunity to write down the questions/ task or print it and this gives them the chance to reduce screen time. If your child is reluctant to record a written response to a question it is fine to allow them to record a voice note so that they can answer it verbally. Similarly, if they are refusing/ reluctant to engage in a lesson, allow them to answer half the questions. Timetable Rock stars, My Maths and Bug Clubs are great resources to keep using alongside SEESAW, please ask for these codes if you need them.

If you are concerned about your child/ren's progress, access to ICT or have a query over the content of remote learning, please contact your child's class teacher or Head of Year via Seesaw or the school email address, who will be happy to discuss this with you.



















RECEPTION NEWS
